

Hook: Nymph or wet fly size 8-12. Thread: Black 8/0. Tail: Green dyed grizzly. Body: Black yarn. Underrib: Peacock herl. Overrib: Gold or copper wire. Hackle: Green dyed grizzly.



Green Drake Parachute

Hook: Mustad 94831, XL Size: 10-12. Thread: Olive 8/0. Wing Post: Calf tail. Tail: Moose hair. Body: Peacock herl.

Hackle: Green dyed grizzly.

All of these flies were originated by Theb Bakelaar of The Hague, Netherlands a very talented tier who specializes in bead heads.



Flash Gunn

Hook: Tiemco 2312, #10-14. Head: Gold Bead. Tail: Black Hackle Fibers. Abdomen: Pearl Flashabou. Wingcase: Pearl Flashabou Thorax: Black Hair-Tron.

Bead Head Black Devil

Hook: Tiemco 200R, #10-14 Head: Gold Bead. Medium Gold Wire. Rib: Abdomen: Thin Black Chenille.

Black Soft Hackle. Legs: Thorax: Chartreuse Wool.
